



In these new paintings I am building on some of the ideas and techniques I touched upon in the earlier drawings 'Sucker Love', 'Broken Rebel' and 'Live Forever'. At that time I stripped all the colour and media from the work leaving myself with a stick of charcoal, some graphite and as a luxury, the brown of

the sanguine oil pencil. In these three I have allowed myself one colour of paint per panel; however the focus is still very much upon drawing, line and mark making. The compositions have been heavily influenced by Japanese poster design of the 1960s.
